INTRODUCTION TO THE QUALITY STANDARDS

This course has been developed to provide learners with an understanding of the Aged Care Quality Standards.

Target Audience

This course has been designed to introduce you to the Aged Care Quality Standards and is aimed at leaders, managers, and other staff members responsible for the delivery of care and services to consumers receiving residential aged care and home care services.

The Aged Care Quality Standard Introduction course is a short course designed to give learners an overview of each Aged Care Quality Standard. Each Standard will be explored in further detail in individually available courses.

Learning Outcomes

FALL PREVENTION IN HOME CARE

Course Duration Subject Matter Expert

45 minutes Melissa Sinfield - RN BHSc (Nursing) (Hons 1st class) PhD MACN

This course has been developed to provide learners with an understanding of the serious repercussions of falls, and how to prevent them, in individuals receiving home care.

Target Audience

This course is suitable for staff working in Australian aged home care. It is especially useful for staff who interact directly with aged care consumers, the 'boots on the ground' who spend their days providing personal care. These are the staff who can identify changes in the health or mobility of people receiving care and report it so that falls prevention strategies can be put in place.

Learning Outcomes

Designed to provide personal care workers and other support staff with an understanding of the serious repercussions of falls, as well as:

- what can happen if a client has a fall
- how to identify factors that can increase a client's risk of falling
- the importance of falls prevention strategies, and
- how to identify what can be done to reduce the client's falls risk.

PRIVACY AND THE WORKPLACE

This Privacy and the Workplace course has been developed to provide organisations with an understanding of Australian privacy requirements. It is critical that organisations in Australia understand privacy rights and how the Australian law requires personal information to be protected.

Target Audience



The Privacy and the Workplace course has been designed to provide training for all staff in all Australian organisations. It is particularly relevant to client-facing staff members and those who handle information relating to real persons.

POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT

Course Duration Subject Matter Expert

40 minutes Cerebral Palsy Alliance (CPA)

This course has been developed to exemplify the positive behaviour support approach which focusses on addressing the needs of a person with a disability, and on improving their quality of life. The idea of the course is to introduce these concepts to disability support workers and to encourage them to use positive approaches to behaviour support in their work.

Target Audience

This is course is designed for any person who may be supporting another individual with positive behaviour support.

Learning Outcomes

This course focusses on the following learning outcomes:



- the meaning of 'quality of life' and how to apply strategies to improve the quality of life
 for the people you support
- what the positive behaviour support framework is, why we use it and how to apply the framework in your everyday work life
- how to recognise and implement proactive strategies when presented with behaviours of concern, as well as analyse the function of the behaviour, and
- the impact of communication and the importance of understanding both verbal and nonverbal communication.

REPORTING ABUSE AND SERIOUS INCIDENTS IN AGED CARE

Reporting Abuse and Serious Incidents in Aged Care is Kineo's elder abuse and neglect training course. This online course has been developed to provide caregivers with the tools to identify the signs and symptoms of abuse or neglect, and how to take action when abuse or neglect is identified. The course looks at the risk factors for older people, including those living independently whether in home care or in an assisted living facility.

Target Audience

This course is suitable for caregivers and other healthcare professionals who provide care to older people in Australia. This course functions as a part of a healthcare organisation's duty of care and elder abuse training.

Learning Outcomes

This online course provides caregivers and other healthcare professionals with the following training.

This course provides an understanding of:

- background to and the definitions and prevalence of the abuse of older people in Australia
- types of abuse most commonly experienced by older people



- requirements for the reporting of abuse of an older person in your care
- roles and responsibilities of staff around the abuse of a person in their care
- barriers to staff reporting suspected and actual abuse, and
- actions to take if there is imminent threat to an older person.

MANUAL TASKS IN AGED CARE

Kineo's Manual Tasks for Workers training course provides practical manual handling training and risk management training. The course covers risk factors associated with a variety of hazardous manual tasks. This is based on physical risk and an organisation's work health and safety responsibilities. This course is ideal training alongside an organisation's work processes and code of practice.

Target Audience

This manual tasks training course is designed for any worker who performs manual tasks. This includes workers who perform hazardous manual tasks, such as lifting heavy objects.

It may also be relevant for workers who perform other manual tasks. This includes those working with bulky loads, dangerous loads, vibrations, repetitive tasks, lifting people and handling animals.

Learning Outcomes

This course provides learners with behaviourally focused training and outline of risk factors related to manual tasks.

- Activities considered hazardous manual tasks and the associated risk factors.
- How to assess manual tasks.
- Risk management strategies.
- Techniques for performing manual tasks safely.
- The course encourages the use of mechanical aids, based on the hierarchy of hazard controls.



DRIVER SAFETY
